Are you ready to save money by learning how to mount your own artwork correctly? Are your mounts slipping or is your artwork buckling out of the mat? Are you using plastic tape – masking, artist, duck, or scotch, or linen tape? Come find out what is wrong with all these tapes and the right material to use. Do you want to present a professional framing of your artwork? Come to my class, I will teach you what tricks professionals use in frame shops; what curators do in museums and what I do.

Welcome to my Mounting Workshop! This is a synopsis of what you will be learning and doing during your workshop and a Supply List for the class. Since there are many things to learn in the mounting process, plan to complete one 8x10" matted project during class. You will need to bring with you at least one item to be mounted (approximately 2" x 4" to 6" x 8"): a Drawing, Photograph, Painting, Postcard, etc. You can bring more than one project to be mounted if time permits but keep them on the small side; you are learning new tools and techniques, and will need practice to perfect your skills.

Synopsis of Class:

- Choosing the Correct Materials for your project - Reversible or Non Reversible
- Mount Boards, Corners, Hinges, Glues. What should you buy?
- Demo of Reversible Mounts – Corners and T-hinges.
- Demo of Non Reversible Mounts – Spray Mount, Cold Mount, Tapes & Glues
- Hands-on Mounting of your project
- Problem Solving – Options, Fixes & Tools to help

Supplies provided by the Workshop

- Mount Board (8 x 10) Acid Free
- Hinges, Corners, Tapes, Glues, Cold Mount etc. that you will need to mount your artwork.
- Handout

Mounting Works on Paper Student Supply List

YOU NEED TO BRING UNDERLINED, (IF YOU HAVE OTHER STUFF BRING IT)

- Pencil & Note Paper
- Art, Photo, Postcard, etc. (6" x 8" or smaller i.e., 4 x 6 photos) for an 8" x 10" mat.
- Mat Board (8 x 10) beveled with an opening at least ¼" smaller all the way around than your image. Example: Photo 4 x 6 = Mat Opening 3 ½ x 5 ½" Cut Mat sides 2 ¼" all the way around. (The Mat you cut in mat cutting workshop)

We will have in class a sample mounting kits of all the items we demonstrate in class. Both a Reversible Mounting Kit and a Non Reversible Mounting Kit will be available for you to buy after class for \$5 each. We want you to be able to try new products without having to buy everything at once.
